Through this collaborative effort, we ensure that Think Human Fund ambassadors and local teams are involved from the start, guaranteeing both follow-up and successful outcomes for all projects we support. Looking ahead with exciting projects!

Today, **1 in 5 young people** worldwide are neither in training, education, nor employment, leaving them unprepared for the job market and autonomy. To tackle this pressing issue, we are committed to fostering social connections and creating pathways to opportunity. We are supporting initiatives promoting social-emotional learning with **Glasswing** in Latin America and aim to enhance entrepreneurial skills through programs like **Junior Achievement** in the Nordic countries. We want to make education more accessible by working with visually impaired youth with **Children and Dream** in South Korea, provide appropriate support to children with learning disabilities at **Association Imagine le Monde** in Cote d'Ivoire. Additionally, we are championing higher education support for autistic youth with **Next Step Transitions** in the UK and equipping young people with Social-Emotional Learning knowledge and digital skills through **Dignity for Children** in Malaysia. Our commitment includes funding scholarships, as seen with **Project PEARLS** in the Philippines, ensuring that all young people have the opportunity to thrive personally and professionally.



Every year, 100 million hectares of valuable, productive land are degraded, and among the estimated eight million species of animals and plants on our planet today, one million are at risk of extinction. Our goal is to foster resilience, knowledge, and enable proactive measures in response to climate change. In 2025, for example, we aim to support projects protecting biodiversity, such as the rehabilitation of forests and the restoration of the Xochimilco wetland in Mexico City with **Movimiento De Jovenes Por El Agua**, as well as tree planting initiatives in Germany. We will promote recycling efforts through **Zero Waste** in Senegal, provide drinking water in the Philippines with **Planet Water Foundation**, support farmers with **Green OpenLab** in Morocco and **Hometree** in Ireland. Moreover, we seek to encourage ecological practices, increase youth's awareness on environmental protection in Romania with **Ateliere Fara Frontiere** or in Algeria with **Education for Employment**.
